Welcome Back

As well as daily reading sessions in school, can we please request that your child reads at least 3 times a week at home.



Industrial Staffordshire

Our Autumn term topic is based around 'Industrial Staffordshire'. Through this topic, we will explore the Industrial Revolution and the key changes and developments in our area. We will explore the pottery industry and the global impact that this had focusing on Josiah Wedgwood as a significant figure. Our Geography focus will look at land use around Stafford and how this continues to change over time.

Spellings

Every week, your child will be given new spellings to learn and explore. They have time in school to investigate these spellings and to identify the trickiest part within each word. Throughout the week, the children will continuously explore these spellings through a range of activities. A progress check will be administered at the end of the week (Friday). We actively encourage children to practice at home so their confidence grows throughout the year.

We are really looking forward to our Black Country Museum, which will provide our pupils with an immersive experience of the Industrial Revolution. We will be participating in a coal mine tour, as well as exploring what life was like in the Victorian Era.
